

# Your NHS blood pressure check


Thank you for having your blood pressure checked at the pharmacy.

## Why get your blood pressure checked?

- High blood pressure, also called hypertension, is a condition which can be controlled to reduce your risk of a heart attack, stroke or other cardiovascular disease.
- In the UK there are about five million adults (one in every nine) who have high blood pressure without even knowing it, since high blood pressure itself rarely causes symptoms.
- The British Heart Foundation estimates that high blood pressure causes over 50% of heart attacks and strokes.

## High blood pressure – know your numbers

Blood pressure is the force of your blood moving against the walls of your arteries. It is expressed as two numbers, one above the other:

### **Background to the service**

As set out in the NHS Long Term Plan, there is now a national focus on preventing disease. This focus is a vital part of the strategy for managing demand on NHS services, maximising the efficient use of NHS resources and improving population health.

The commissioning of a new community pharmacy service - the NHS blood pressure service - is part of this strategy and is free of charge to people aged 40 and over.

#### What are the benefits of this service?

According to recent estimates, there are around 5 million undiagnosed cases of high blood pressure in England.

Over **8,000** pharmacies have signed up to provide the service to date, and pharmacists have completed over **395,** COC clinic blood pressure checks and over **18,00** Oambulatory blood pressure monitoring checks. By investing further in this service and extending it, community pharmacies can do more to identify those 5 million undiagnosed cases.

This initiative is part of NHS England's **Core20PLUS5** approach, which supports the reduction of health inequalities by targetting the most deprived **20**% of the population (**plus** other disadvantaged groups) by focusing on **5** clinical areas, of which hypertension case-finding is one.

Community pharmacies are the most accessible healthcare resource. They can be accessed without the need for an appointment and the public visit pharmacies frequently.

## What can you do to help?

There are a number of supportive actions parliamentarians can take to support community pharmacies

- **Become a pharmacy champion in parliament by supporting PSNC's four point action plan** and our call for a Pharmacy First programme to be adopted in England.
- **Contact your Local Pharmaceutical Committee** to hear first-hand the current situation faced by community pharmacists in your constituency.
- > Arrange a visit to a pharmacy in your constituency either through your LPC, or by contacting the PSNC via commsteam@psnc.org.uk. You can then discuss these issues with them and their parents, to find out more about the vital role that pharmacies in supporting good health in your communities.
