# SCRa to NCRS Switchover

#### NCRS portal and SCRa portal scheduled will close at end of Sept 2023

- National Care Records Service (NCRS) is the improved successor to the SCRa.
- If pharmacy NCRS users do not take action to switch from the SCRa to the NCRS, they will automatically be redirected from 29th September 2023.
- NCRS requires NHS Credential Management and NHS Identity Agent to be installed. NCRS does not work in Internet Explorer (IE) (any version and IE11 in Compatibility mode) or Edge in IE mode.
- A legacy "Back to SCRa" button will be available for those users needing to access OVM (Overseas, Visitors, Migrants – or as it will be known Chargeable status) until this functionality becomes available in NCRS.
- The "Back to SCRa" button will be removed, once all functionality from SCRa is deployed in NCRS.
- NCRS users will have already seen the following messages since February 2023 in the event that using an old non-supported browser (believed to be in less than 2% of cases across all SCRa/NCRS users).



• <u>Reminders</u> have been issued out from NHS England and Community Pharmacy England about the transition and September 2023 transition since early within this calendar year. This has included Community Pharmacy England newsletter bulletin updates.

#### NCRS auto redirection & integration

- The 'Auto Redirect' has been successfully piloted with thousands of users in different health and care settings, with very few issues.
- Existing RBAC/Smartcard Access rights remain unaltered and continue to work in NCRS, with no changes required.
- NCRS will include all existing SCRa functionality and new functionality as future offerings develop - see for the <u>NCRS Roadmap</u> for details.
- GP system SCR PTV functionality remains unchanged and continues as is.
- NCRS uses a standalone portal. It can, therefore, be accessed regardless of what IT system an organisation is using.

## <u>CIS2</u>

CIS1 deprecation: Suppliers are being encouraged to look towards transition to CIS2.

Pharmacy suppliers can look at integration with CIS2 well ahead of final CIS1 depreciation date. Smartcards require HSCN (or a virtual HSCN), whilst newer CIS2 options for authentication not available with CIS1:

- Security keys e.g. 'dongles'.
- Microsoft Authenticator
- NHS CIS2 authentication iPad app

The CIS2 team are looking at continued development of the options, and use cases for 'breaking away' from the burden associated with requirement for HSCN.

The group fed back that less requirement on HSCN and greater ability to use NHS IT mobile devices would be very helpful for pharmacy teams.
