NHS prescription charges are a tax collected for the Government in England*. The money collected <u>does not help</u> to fund this pharmacy and is unrelated to the cost of your medicine(s).

Some items may have more than one charge, e.g. elastic hosiery; a member of the pharmacy team will explain if that is the case.
