Frequently asked questions

Why is this analysis being undertaken?

What will the study examine?

- Consider a defined number of different pharmacy types and how their cost structures vary.
- Consider a defined number of different dispensing models and different clinical services, and the potential for interdependencies within and across these.

What will the study not examine?

- Consider or examine the medicines reimbursement model.
- Consider pharmacy in GP practices, in secondary care, or outside of England.
- Explore the economic value of NHS Pharmacy Services.
- Directly assess whether pharmacies could deliver services more cheaply than GPs. We will not look at GP costs in detail.
- Consider alternative funding models beyond focusing on the impact of different services mix.
- Make policy recommendations regarding the future of community pharmacy services.

Why should you participate in the analysis?

- The analysis has been designed independently to ascertain the current state of Community Pharmacy financial sustainability and viability of the sector.
- The findings and publication of the analysis has the potential to shape Community Pharmacy of the future.
- The more contractors that participate in the study the more representative it will be for the sector.
