



This factsheet serves as a guide of the categories of exemption from NHS prescription charges and provides details of the evidence required to prove entitlement to free NHS prescriptions where applicable. A patient's exemption status applies at the time of dispensing.

**Please note:** Patients are not required to make a signed declaration if the prescription has been confirmed as exempt by the **<u>Real Time Exemption Checking (RTEC)</u>** system.

## **Patient requirements**

Pharmacy teams are in no way responsible for the accuracy of a patient's declaration; this remains the responsibility of the patient. If a patient is unsure whether they are entitled to free prescriptions, pharmacy staff should advise the patient to pay for their prescription and provide them with an FP57 Refund form with information on how to claim a refund at a later date.
