

Childhood Flu Vaccination Service: Online information sources for parents and carers

When pharmacy professionals are providing vaccinations to protect children from flu, there are websites that parents and carers can be signposted to for further information on the vaccines or on flu.

To support any vaccines provided, pharmacy professionals should signpost parents and carers to the marketing authorisation holder's patient information leaflets (hard copies will be available within the medicine's packaging, with copies also being available from medicines.org.uk/emc).
