

The NHS Prescription Charge for 2026/27 remains at

£9.90

per item

NHS prescription charges are a contribution to NHS funding and are unrelated to the cost of your medicine(s). The pharmacy collects these charges on behalf of Government and the NHS.

Some items may have more than one charge, e.g. elastic hosiery; a member of the pharmacy team will explain if that is the case.

If you need multiple prescription items or are prescribed certain HRT medicines, the appropriate Prescription Prepayment Certificate (PPC) could save you money. For more information visit: www.nhsbsa.nhs.uk/ppc

Certain patient groups are entitled to free NHS prescriptions and certain items (e.g. contraceptives) are free-of-charge on the NHS.
